From the Principal's Desk

Anjamma Agi Reddy Engineering College for Women was established in 2010 by Mahaveer Education Society, who have been running Mahaveer Institute of Science and Technology for over a decade. I take this opportunity to draw the attention of students to some issues of great importance. Firstly, I want all students to take the best care of their health. The key to good health is a good *diet* and adequate *exercise*. Ensure that your diet consists of a wide variety of leafy vegetables (*Palaak, Ponnaganti, Menthi, Bachali* etc), a mixture of oils (sun flower, gingelly, ground nut, rice bran, olive etc) and as many fruit as possible. Eat carrots, cucumber, beet root and tomato as salad. Avoid *chat* and deep fried stuff. Never lose an opportunity to walk or climb or play. Use the staircase instead of the elevator for going to higher floors in the college. From far and near

Thank you dear Microbes!

A large component of the oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico from the BP Deep Horizon well was natural gas, including methane. Scientists measured the hydrocarbons in the ocean and found that

the methane was degraded by naturally-occurring bacteria far quicker than they had expected. It will be great if Mother Nature is benevolent with the spilled oil too.

Corruption and earthquakes

In the course of a construction, it is easy to cover up the substandard work of the previous stage. Building collapse is the greatest killer (90%) during an earthquake. Though it is relatively easy to make quake-proof structures, in some countries the building industry is rife with corruption, shortcuts and lax inspections. This compounds the ignorance and poverty which prevent use of cement and steel adequately, like in Haiti last year. If the corruption index of the least corrupt country (Iceland) is 1, that of India is 88, while China is better off at 78. The corruption index is found to increase more than linearly as the per-capita income of a country decreases. The increasing corruption has put brakes on aid flow from the richer countries.

Stopping the spread of avian flu in poultry

While many people are coping with swine flu and seasonal flu, the avian influenza virus is spreading in poultry again. South Korea recently confirmed its first outbreak of avian flu since 2008, having to cull many thousands of birds. The conventional approach to stopping the spread is to use vaccines. But molecular virologists in the UK are trying a new approach - genetically engineering chickens with molecules that bind onto and block transmission of the virus – with the eventual aim of making them immune.

Electric Superbikes

Using alternative sources of fuel is the need of the hour, to minimise global warming. At the Detroit Auto Show in the US, an all electric superbike made its world racing debut, not in a special class of electric machines, but against petrol powered motorbikes. The new bike competed well against the fossil fuel powered equivalents – coming third and second. It develops 194 bhp and has a max speed of 240 km/hr. The heavy battery leaves no space for the pillion rider, though.

Wikepedia

Wikepedia (not Wikileaks) the free online encyclopaedia consisting only of contributions from its readers has completed 10 years. Though scoffed at by sceptics for allowing all sundry to edit, it has become handy and is viewed by 410 million visitors a month. With China virtually cut off and Western markets saturating, Wikipedia is targeting India first and possibly Brazil next to reach its goal of one billion users, while continuing to be a non-profit organisation sustained by donations. More than a lakh contributors write and edit articles for free in 270 languages. The site carries 17 million articles in English, adding 1100 every day. If you wish to give your own article, do include authentic references to avoid deletion.

Exam anxiety

Many people get crippled with nerves before a big test. But now psychologists have found, by

experiment, observation and inference, that if you spend ten minutes writing about your worries for a forthcoming test just before you take it, you perform much better. Downloading worries on paper has been found to upgrade score from B minus to B plus among high school students. May be useful for end-semester examinations.

Tsunami of rats!

After the Hungarian flood of red mud (from Aluminium production), now there is a threat of rat floods, this time in India and Bangladesh. Once in 50 years, the bamboo trees in the forests bloom and their fruit drop to the ground. Suddenly there are plenty of bamboo seeds for rats to eat, which multiply fast. The breeding rate is directly proportional to the food available. Soon they consume every thing available. Faced with shortage of food, they invade the fields of the nearby villages, just in time to gobble up the ripened crops. Because it happens so rarely, farmers are caught off guard. One technique has been to plant crops with a shorter cycle so that the harvesting is over by the time the rats arrive. But the yield is less. Conventional rat traps or vacuum suction are also used which do not seem to be very effective.

Justice without delay

In China it takes a maximum of three months for getting an accused tried for an offence, convicted and sent to jail. Civil or commercial disputes are either settled through arbitration within six months. The entire judiciary, from the lower court to the highest court, is well connected through a computer network. The case management system with well-knit archives is so scientific that every information is displayed on the screen for the benefit of the litigants and judges, the moment a case is taken up for hearing. In a criminal case, information on the accused, including the thumb impression, weapons seized from the scene of occurrence, and witness depositions can be obtained on the computer screen during the hearing/trial. The written judgments would be not more than four-five pages and the final decision would be incorporated in one page.
